Here's a checklist of things you should do on a college visit. Use the lines below each task to take notes and take additional notes in the Notes section. Record what you like, what you don't like, and other important observations, which may help you make a decision about colleges later on.

•	Meet with the Office of Disability Services. Use the <u>Office of Disability Services Meeting Handout</u> to plan your questions.
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	Meet or have a meal with a current student with cochlear implants or hearing loss.
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	Set up a meeting with sports coaches, if you are interested in playing a sport.
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	Set up a meeting with a professor, specifically one in an area of interest (i.e. potential majors).
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	Our campus. O Visit student housing. O Visit a dining hall. O Visit athletic and recreational facilities. O Visit a classroom. O Visit the bookstore. O Determine if the campus is a walking, biking, or driving campus.
	sit in on a class (if you're unable to sit in, try to see a classroom to get an idea of space and set up). Observe class sizes, faculty teaching style, and classroom setting.
	Check out the computer facilities/labs.
	ind a school newspaper, read student bulletin boards, and/or listen to student radio to get a sense of the school atmosphere.
