Private scholarship

Disability support organizations fund scholarships for people with disabilities. Examples of scholarships targeted to students with hearing loss include:

Talent Search, Educational Opportunity Centers, and Special Services for Disadvantaged Students

Talent Search and Educational Opportunity Centers are federally funded programs located in colleges and private and public organizations across the country. These programs provide counseling and other services, including academic and financial assistance, to disadvantaged students and students with disabilities.

Federal student aid

Financial aid for eligible students to cover educational expenses, such as tuition and fees, room and board, books and supplies, and transportation, at an eligible college. Federal student aid includes grants, work-study programs, and loans.

State programs

Each state has various grants and scholarships available to in-state residents.
